**Mr. Stephen Henthorne** (USA) is an internationally experienced senior consultant and ombudsman, with proven leadership skills and 30 years of diverse experience in working with global, corporate, national, and international stability programs in the critical subject matter fields of Disaster Management, Humanitarian Assistance Operations, International Reconstruction Development, and Alternative Dispute Resolution; with an emphasis on the relief of Internally Displaced Persons and Refugees, in complex emergency and post-conflict Stability Operations.

He has extensive experience as a senior advisor in a multitude of global civil-military missions. In support of those efforts he has served as a Visiting Professor of Civil-Military Relations at the U.S. Army Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute, a division of the U.S. Army War College, Professor of Civil-Military Operations at the Joint Readiness Training Center, Lecturer at the Joint Special Operations University (JSOU), Lecturer and Directing Staff at the Canadian Peace Support Training Centre, and Visiting Lecturer at the Royal Military Academy – Sandhurst Foundation, the Joint Services Command & Staff College (UK), the NATO accredited CIMIC Centre of Excellence, and the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs.
